Aims

The main aim of the conference is to update the global status of the threatened Eastern Imperial Eagle (*last publication is from 2011*).

Therefore, the organizers invited presenters to summarize the status of national or regional populations between 2019 and 2023.

Besides, focused research topics are also welcomed, such as studies on dispersal (satellite tracking, ringing), diet, population dynamics, genetics, threats or the efficiency of conservation activities.

 - Recognizing increasing populations & increasing survey efficiency
 - Identifying gaps in knowledge
2. Dispersal (satellite tracking)
 - Recognizing results of new studies
3. Threats
 - Addressing main threats (electrocution, persecution, habitat degradation, collisions)
 - Special attention on emerging new threats (windfarms, solar power stations)
4. Proposals for the location of the X. International Conference on the Conservation of the Eastern Imperial Eagle in 2028 (together with Eagles of the Palearctic?)
